



WHO USES THE LIBRARY?



FY23 ACHIEVEMENTS

Highlighting the top five achievements of the West Point Public Library over the past year. We've been on a roll implementing new services and updating library spaces.

1 TECHNOLOGY UPGRADE

Our computer switch, original to when the building was built in 2004, is in need of an upgrade. Drake Hardware and Software will evaluate our current equipment and provide us with recommendations going forward.

2 TITANIC EXHIBIT

The library will be hosting a Titanic Exhibit on loan from the Burlington Public Library's Vacation Through Time Program. Patrons will Get an exclusive tour, historical facts about the destination, and enjoy interactive exhibits.

WEEDING PROJECT
