FY21 STATISTICS




WHO USES THE LIBRARY?

2020-21 ANNUAL CIRCULATION




LIBRARY CARDHOLDERS

SUMMER READING PROGRAM

Our SRP was held outside this year with a variety of fun, entertaining programs, including Bubble Stations and the ISU Insect Zoo! In addition, we continued our Story Walk around the square with two new stories. Kids enjoyed the Color Scavenger Hunt and Chalk the Walk while adults got creative with a painting party.

SECURITY UPDATES

New LED lights were installed along the south and east side of the library. A new security camera was also installed on the south side of the building and one on the east side was replaced. New parking stops were purchased to replace damaged ones in the parking area behind the library.

UPDATED WEBSITE

Thanks to the State Library of Iowa, our library website has been replaced with a new platform. The new site features a user friendly layout and enables access on a wide range of mobile devices. It's also easier for staff to program and keep updated.

TECHNOLOGY

New computers and software, including a lap top and a desk top computer were purchased. The new desktop computer replaces an older model in our Genealogy room. The lap top replaced the director's previous one, which is now available for public use.

LIBRARY HOURS

The library hours were permanently changed to 11-6 M-F and 9-2 on Saturday. This was based on data as staff was seeing a significant decrease in patrons using the library the last hour it was open. The hour change has been well received by patrons.

LOOKING FORWARD

Each year, the library board and staff plan for new and improved services for our community. Below are three of our top priorities to get started on in FY22.

DIGITAL ACCESS

Due to qualifying for an ARPA grant, the library will be increasing digital services to children. For the next year the library will provide free access to TumbleBook Library, an online collection of e-books for children. In addition, interactive nonfiction books from Junior Library Guild will also be purchased and promoted.

FINE FREE

A recent trend in libraries is to go fine free to alleviate inequity by getting rid of library fines. The ALA recently passed a resolution on monetary fines as a form of social inequity and encouraged libraries to remove barriers to library access.

WEEDING

An ongoing goal in our library is to continually weed our collection. Weeding is a vital process for an active collection because it ensures the collection stays current, relevant, and in good condition. Plans are to continue in the Juvenile Nonfiction, Western/SciFi, and DVD sections,
