


# WHO USES THE LIBRARY?

# FY22 ACHIEVEMENTS

Highlighting the top five achievements of the West Point Public Library over the past year. We've been on a roll implementing new services and updating library spaces.

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### SUMMER READING PROGRAM

Our SRP was held outside again with a variety of fun, entertaining programs, including Butterfly Tents, Bubble Stations and the ISU Insect Zoo! In addition, we continued our Story Walk around the square. Kids enjoyed the Animal Print Scavenger Hunt, while adults got creative with a painting party!

# ARPA GRANT

The library received a \$2,700 ARPA Grant. Money was spent on on increasing digital services to children, including purchase of a year's subscription to TumbleBooks, an online collection of e-books for children as well as interactive nonfiction books from the Junior Library Guild and four Lego Robotic Kits.

# FINE FREE

In May of 2022, the library went fine free This alleviates inequity by getting rid of library fines. The ALA recently passed a resolution on monetary fines as a form of social inequity and encouraged libraries to remove barriers to library access.

# TECHNOLOGY

A new desktop computer and software was purchased for public use to replace an older model. WhoFi, a state funded resource, introduced additional tools to help the library manage community space, including wifi usage rates, program, attendance, and program reservations.

# MULTI PANEL DISPLAY

Thank to generous donations and memorials, an additional multi panel swinging display was purchased to allow for the better preservation and access to historical St. Mary's school pictures of classes and sports teams.

# LOOKING FORWARD

Each year, the library board and staff plan for new and improved services for our community. Below are three of the our top priorities to get started on in FY22.

# GLASS PLATE NEGATIVES

Our two year glass negative project is coming to a close. The negatives have been scanned, a spreadsheet created, and storage purchased. Currently, the 320 images are being uploaded to the Iowa Heritage Digital Collection website. An open house will be held upon completion.

# ACCREDITATION

The library will be completing the necessary paperwork to renew Tier 3 status and maintain state accreditation. The library works hard on meeting the standards as set forth by the state in all areas of operation. Accredication is valid for three years.

# CRICUT

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Funds were donated to the library to purchase a Cricut, a computer controlled cutting machine. Over the next year, staff will be trained, a policy developed for patron use, and hopefully, classes offered to the community.
